Carex appalachica is a very attractive fine-leaved sedge. It is non-aggressive and maintains a tidy mounded form. The thin arching blades create a delicate hair-like mop, up to 2' around.

It is one of the few grass-like plants tolerant of full shade. It is found in moist to dry upper elevation woodlands. It is very drought resistant once established, and will not tolerate consistently wet soil. Easy to grow in average to poor soil, it is low maintenance and can be used as a specimen in a shaded rock garden, or planted in groups to create an effective ground cover.
