

Sedum ternatum 'Larinem Park'

Light Requirements: **part-sun, part-shade, shade**

Soil Moisture: **dry, moist**

Soil Description: **rich, average, poor, loam, gravel/rock**

Height: **3"-6"**

Recommended Spacing: **12"-16"**

Bloom Time: **April, May**

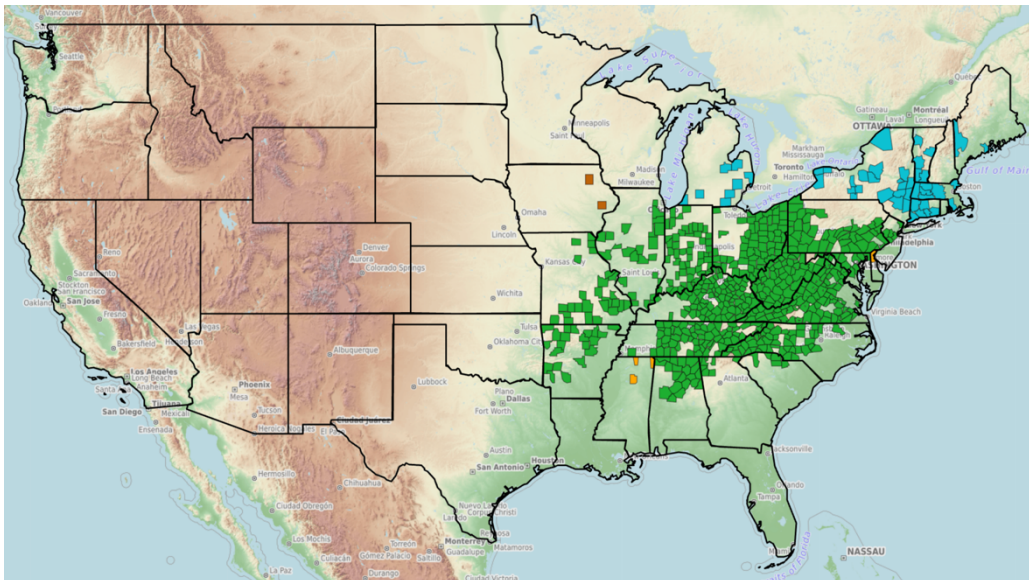
Bloom Color: **white**

Hardiness Zone: **4, 5, 6, 7, 8**

Additional Tags: **colonizing, deer resistant, drought tolerant, evergreen/semi-evergreen, rock garden plant, shade garden plant**

Sedum ternatum 'Larinem Park' forms an attractive low-growing ground cover of whorled, green, succulent leaves. When in bloom, the abundant, attractive, fragrant, white star-shaped flowers seem to be sprinkled upon the colony.

'Larinem Park' is more tolerant of heavy soil in full shade than the straight species and can be grown in full sun with adequate moisture. The creeping branches easily self root during the growing season if broken off. A low maintenance plant, excellent ground cover and filler plant for a perennial flower bed. It spreads both vegetatively and by seed, but is not aggressive. The blooming period lasts about a month, beginning mid to late-spring.
