bluestem goldenrod



Light Requirements: **part-sun, part-shade, shade**

Soil Moisture: **dry, moist**

Soil Description: **average, loam, clay, gravel/rock**

Height: **1'-3'**

Recommended Spacing: **12"-18"**

Bloom Time: **August, September, October**

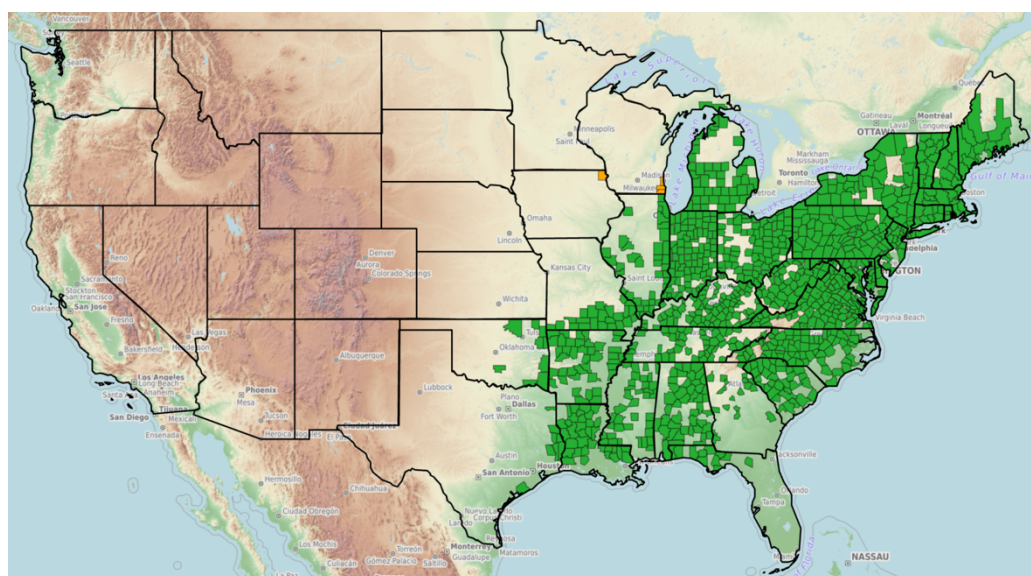
Bloom Color: **yellow**

Hardiness Zone: **4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9**

Additional Tags: **deer resistant, drought tolerant, colonizing, pollinator favorite, rock garden plant, shade garden plant**

Solidago caesia is one of the most elegant of goldenrods. Its purplish, gently arching stems are covered in their entirety with loose clusters of bright yellow flowers, the highest concentration of which occurs toward the tips. It has a long blooming period of about a month, ranging from late summer to mid-fall.

Easy to grow and adaptable. It is very tolerant of shaded conditions, performs exceptionally well in part-sun to dappled light, and moist to dry well-drained soil. It might require additional watering when grown in full sun, but is otherwise considered drought resistant. It is not particularly aggressive, and a good goldenrod for small gardens.
