

Symphyotrichum cordifolium 'Avondale' is a floriferous, shorter selection of blue wood aster with light lavender-blue, daisy-like flowers with a yellow center. It has branching, upright, arching stems up to 3' long. A late season bloomer, with and extended bloom time. The flowers are up to a 1/2 inch in diameter, long-lived, and emerge in dense, rounded clusters.

'Avondale' prefers partially shaded sites, but will tolerate more sun or deeper shade. For best flowering, it needs three or more hours of sun during the day. It grows in average, dry to moist soil, but does not like to be consistently wet. Like the parent, 'Avondale' spreads readily via seed and rhizomes, so is best placed where it can be allowed to roam.
